

Constitution and By-laws
of

Constitution

ARTICLE I:

1. The corporate name of this organization shall be the Kittredge Civic Association (KCA).

ARTICLE II:

Objectives -

1. The KCA is organized exclusively for charitable and educational purposes within the meaning of section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue Code).

2. To advance and enhance the community known as Kittredge, Colorado.

3. To plan and carry out such programs as will benefit the community and its populace.

4. To purchase or acquire real or other properties necessary for the fulfillment of the KCA's objectives.

5. To do anything necessary, which is suitable and proper, for the accomplishment of any purpose herein set forth, and which may be recognized as proper and lawful objects of civic organizations, all of which shall be consistent with public interest, as well as beneficial to the community which the KCA represents.

6. Notwithstanding any other provisions of these articles, the KCA shall not be a party to any activities not permitted to be conducted (a) by an organization exempt from Federal income tax under section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue Code) or (b) by an organization, contributions to which are deductible under section 170 (c) (2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue Code).

7. No part of the assets or net earnings of the KCA shall inure to the benefit of, nor be distributable to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the organization shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth. No substantial part of the activities of the KCA shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation; and the KCA shall not participate in, or intervene in any political campaign (including the publishing or distribution of statements) on behalf of any candidate for public office.

ARTICLE II, (Continued):

8. Upon the dissolution of the KCA, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code (or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue Code), or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the Court of Common Pleas of the county in which the principal office of the KCA is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

ARTICLE III:

Officers -

1. The affairs and management of the KCA shall be under the supervision of an Executive Council consisting of seven members.
2. The Executive Council shall consist of the KCA's President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, and three additional members to be known as Councilmembers-at-Large.
3. The manner of election to the Executive Council shall be as prescribed in the by-laws.

ARTICLE IV:

Amendments -

1. Any proposed change of the Constitution may be presented by either a majority vote of the Executive Council, or by the signature of ten or more Voting Members, and shall be voted on at a regular business meeting of the KCA, called for that purpose. Said meeting shall occur within ninety days after the proposal is made.
2. This Constitution and accompanying by-laws shall be considered adopted when they have been approved by a majority of Voting Members present at an open meeting called for that purpose.
